# RESULTS OF THE ARBROATH WEST, LETHAM & FRIOCKHEIM BY-ELECTION REPORT BY KATHRYN LINDSAY, CHIEF EXECUTIVE & RETURNING OFFICER

# 1. ABSTRACT

1.1 The purpose of this Report is to advise members of the outcome of the Arbroath West, Letham & Friockheim by-election which was held on Thursday 25 April 2024.

# 3. RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Council:-
  - (i) note that Jack Alistair James Cruickshanks was duly elected as a Councillor for the Arbroath West, Letham & Friockheim Ward of Angus Council.

# 4. BACKGROUND

4.1 Following the resignation of Councillor David Fairweather on 9 February 2024 a by-election was held on Thursday 25 April 2024 to elect one councillor to the Arbroath West, Letham & Friockheim ward of Angus Council.

#### 5. CURRENT POSITION

5.1 The number of first preference votes received by each candidate was:

Mark David FINDLAY	Scottish Green Party	176
Mark HILTON	Scottish Labour Party	644
Sandra O'SHEA	Scottish Liberal Democrats	333
Kathleen WOLF	Scottish National Party (SNP)	1,175

The quota for this election was 2,006. As no candidate was elected at the first stage, the candidate with the least number of votes was eliminated and their second preference votes redistributed. This process was repeated until a candidate reached the quota and was elected to fill the vacancy. As a result of this process Jack Alistair James Cruickshanks was duly elected to serve as a Councillor for the Arbroath West, Letham & Friockheim ward of Angus Council at Stage 5 with 2,450 votes.

The total number of valid votes cast at this election was 4,010.

The turnout was for this election was 29.4%.
