# FAMILY, EDUCATION AND JUSTICE COMMITTEE – 30 MAY 2024 INTERIM PERFORMANCE UPDATE – EDUCATION AND LIFELONG LEARNING KELLY MCINTOSH, DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION AND LIFELONG LEARNING

# 1. ABSTRACT

This report provides a summary of Angus Council performance against the "core stretch measures" identified in the national Framework for Recovery and Accelerating Progress.

## 2. ALIGNMENT TO THE COUNCIL PLAN AND COUNCIL POLICIES

The proposals in this report align to:

### Council Plan 2023-28

- Support children, young people and adults to access appropriate opportunities which allow them to progress in their learning.
- Deliver our statutory obligation and core functions, tailored to suit our available resources and making best use of our data and performance information.

#### 3. RECOMMENDATIONS

#### 4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The updated Framework for Recovery and Accelerating Progress was published in May 2023. The document confirms the Scottish Government's commitment to achieving equity in education and mitigating the impact of poverty on children's outcomes. The Framework defines a set of national "core stretch measures," for which each local authority must identify stretch aims, or targets. Details of the stretch aims for the 2022-23 reporting year are noted in Appendix 1 to this report. Additional "core plus" measures are also identified by local authorities to provide further context to the national dataset.
- 4.2 Data for the core stretch measures is drawn from nationally available sources. Due to the timing of publication, data for the measures in this report was not available when Members of the Children and Learning Committee considered an overview of Education and Lifelong Learning performance in September 2023 (Report 256/23, <a href="Appendix 3">Appendix 3</a> refers).

# 5. CURRENT POSITION

- 5.1 Data relating to the Achievement of Curriculum for Excellence Levels (ACEL) for literacy and numeracy in P1, 4 and 7 was published in December 2023. An overview of performance for the following measures is available at Appendix 2:
  - Primary 1/4/7 ACEL literacy and numeracy all learners, SIMD Quintile 1 (most deprived) and SIMD Quintile 5 (least deprived) (core measures set by Scottish Government as part of the <u>2022-23 Framework for Recovery and Accelerating</u> Progress).

- Primary 1/4/7 ACEL literacy and numeracy children receiving school clothing grant (SCG), and those with care-experience (core plus measures, decided by Angus Council). The choice to use SCG reflects the expansion of Universal Free School Meals (FSM), reducing our ability to rely on FSM as a proxy measure for children impacted by poverty.
- Data for literacy is on page 2 and numeracy is on page 3 of Appendix 2.
- 5.2 The data is presented as percentage achievement. For context the number of children in each cohort is as follows:

  - 1+ Award at SCQF Level 6 (Core Measure from 2023-24) (Page 5)
  - Annual Participation Measure (Core Measure) (Page 6)
  - 5+ Awards at SCQF Level 3 (Core Plus Measure) (Page 7)
  - 5+ Awards at SCQF Level 5 (Core Plus Measure) (Page 8)
  - 3+ Awards at SCQF Level 6 (Core Plus Measure) (Page 9)
  - Initial School Leaver Positive Destinations (Core Plus Measure) (Page 10)

Data is provided for all leavers, those living in SIMD Quintiles 1 (most deprived) and 5 (least deprived), leavers entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) and those with care-experience. FSM is used for the Senior Phase as there is no universal provision, meaning entitlement remains a reliable proxy measure for young people impacted by poverty.

5.4 The data is presented as percentage achievement. For context the base number for each cohort calculation is as follows:
