1. ABSTRACT

The purpose of this report is to seek approval for the appointment of a voting member.

3. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Integration Joint Board notes the appointment of Councillor Chris Beattie, as a voting member of the IJB as approved by Angus Council on 07 November 2024.

4. BACKGROUND

4.1 Angus Integration Joint Board was established in April 2016 in response to the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014.

4.2 The Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Integration Joint Boards) (Scotland) Order 2014 (“the Order”) contains detailed provisions about the membership of an Integrated Joint Board where the Integration Scheme is prepared by one Local Authority. The Order requires that an Integration Joint Board must have three Councillors as nominated by the relevant Local Authority, or other such number as specified by the Local Authority that does not exceed 10 per cent of the number of members. The Angus Integration Joint Board Standing Orders have set out that the voting membership shall comprise of three persons appointed by the Council.

4.3 Following Councillor George Meechan’s resignation, which was noted on 30 October 2024, there is now a vacancy within the Angus Integration Joint Board’s voting membership from persons appointed by Angus Council.

5.1 In reference to the recommendation, Members are asked to note the appointment by Angus Council of Councillor Chris Beattie, as a voting member to the IJB, following the resignation of Councillor George Meechan.
