

### 3 Police Report

Constable Martyn Brennan was absent for the meeting, so SN briefed out latest report (MNCC).

Recent Crimes/issues in the area were reported to the MNCC for assessment period (28/01/2025 - 17/02/2025).

- Recorded Crime: Recorded Crime in the area remains low.
- Monikie Park: We are aware of instances of anti-social behaviour within the park in recent weeks. Patrols have been increased and last week we put information on social media to highlight the issue. We have also liaised with the park rangers and given advice regarding crime prevention/CCTV. Increased patrols will continue as and when time allows.
- Carnoustie Police Office: On 16 January 2025, Carnoustie Police Office closed as part
  of a planned full refurbishment. Officers have relocated to Arbroath, however a drop
  in base has been established at Angus Council Offices on High Street Carnoustie and
  as such there will be no disruption to Policing services in the area. It is anticipated
  that our newly refurbished Police Station will re-open again in March 2025,
  providing a modern fit for purpose Police Office to support our community.
- Neighbourhood Watch Scotland: Your local Community Police Officers have recently completed a course with Neighbourhood Watch Scotland, which allows them to send out immediate emails reporting such things as suspicious activity in the local area, as well as updates on crimes and other useful information, as such they are keen to have as many people as possible locally to sign up to these emails, which in turn could assist in crime detection and prevention. Being a member of Neighbourhood Watch Scotland could also lead to a discount on home insurance. If you would like to sign up, please use the QR Code Below.



- **Speeding:** There continues to be concerns reported regarding motorists not adhering to the speed limits within the Local area, particularly 20mph speed zones. Local Speed Initiatives will continue to be planned where possible, and Road Policing Departments have been notified of these continuing issues for extra attention.
- **↓** The following is guidance provided by Traffic Scotland on enforcement of 20mph limits *Enforcement*.
- 37.Any decision to lower the speed limit to 20 mph should seek to avoid the need for extensive police enforcement, as 20 mph limits will not be routinely enforced, unless it is absolutely necessary and in the interest of casualty reduction.

- The only exception to this is the enforcement of 20 mph speed limits outside schools, which takes place on a regular basis.
- 38. A range of other measures should be employed. These might include marketing and behaviour change initiatives, vehicle actuated signs and traffic management and other traffic calming measures.
- 39. Any changes should be monitored, and where compliance levels are not at an acceptable level, consideration should be given to the addition of traffic calming measures or reverting to a 30-mph limit, if necessary.

Statement Alison Gallacher, Manager, Procurement and Commissioning

"There is a lot of discussion taking place at this end on the subject of Woodland Management Plans at Monikie and Crombie. At this moment in time the plans remain as published on the Engage Angus portal. The outstanding matter in Monikie is currently with Scottish Forestry so it would not be appropriate for any alterations to be made until we received an update from them. As and when we do, we will share this with yourselves (MNCC)"

Graeme Gorrie (resident) discussed that he had met in person several people/groups including Scottish Forestry/Fred Conacher/Angus Council. He believed that there would be a reduction in tree felling permission, pavilion wood reduced down significantly, and consideration given around protected species within the park. He believed that the engage platform would be updated when all information was collated, no timescale was also confirmed.

### 8.2 Monikie Park (ANGUSalive)

Update from Nicola Barbour, Countryside Adventure Team Leader, ANGUSalive

- Nicola forwarded her apologies in advance of meeting, but due to staff development there would be no one available to attend in person at the MNCC meeting.
- Technical teams are due to take down the MCP Playpark Fort Area due to this being condemned, and they are continuing to clear woodland around the sluice North Pond areas.

Some residents in attendance made comment of the following, which we agreed MNCC would ask ANGUSalive for an update for the next meeting/and or attend.

- Maintenance of fencing around the pond areas
- Planting of more flowers/such as snowdrops (reference made to Cambo)
- Re-investment back into play areas if the playpark area is being cleared, leaves very little activities for children, and what would be the plans in future provision.
- Condition of the pond paths for walkers/runners (muddy and slip hazard in some areas).

### 9 Questions from the floor

#### 9.1 Code of Conduct: MNCC

- Graeme Gorrie (resident) raised an issue directed specifically at DMG and SN regarding their "Code of Conduct" and behaviour at previous meeting during discussions around the Aquapark which then led to discussions regarding "lodges" within Monikie Park and comments on social platforms (which Colin Knight initially raised).
- Graeme referred to the COC in relation to personal opinion and preferences of the MNCC specifically again DMcG and SN. He quoted from the previous minutes the issue was agreed re lodges to be "put to bed" and commented that we then brought in personal opinion to the discussion, which is against the COC, citing his actions on social media platforms.
- DMcG re-iterated to Graeme that the matter of lodges had been previously discussed multiple times at meetings (and recorded on minutes), and it had been made clear by multiple senior management that there was no intent to build lodges in Monikie Park and therefore the issue would not be discussed any further during future meetings.
- Graeme Gorrie made comments that DMcG/SN were accepting the word of ANGUSalive, Angus Council and anyone we speak to regarding the lodges/woodland plans, at this point DMcG advised him to temper his language towards MNCC.
- SN explained that it was not a "personal opinion" re the lodges that she was simply presenting the fact in the meeting of what Graeme has and had written and how this could be perceived within the community, she also noted that on multiple times she was interrupted by talking and was asked to let her finish which Graeme did not respect, SN had given Graeme the opportunity to talk however when she was talking he took the opportunity to interrupt on several (4) occasions. SN confirmed that if he had a complaint regarding either of DMcG/SN behaviour then he should follow the complaints procedure and get this investigated.
- DMcG explained that the chair was obligated by our constitution to ensure there is balance in discussions and the opinions or positions of organisations and individuals not in attendance were often mentioned within debates for that reason.

Due to the behaviour and tone of language Graeme used, <u>he was asked to leave the</u> <u>meeting</u> by DMcG. Graeme asked if we were allowed to do this, details of this can be found within the MNCC Constitution. Graeme left the meeting.

- It should be noted that this incident left SN visibly upset by the behaviour and accusations of both the chair and secretary.
- On behalf of all the MNCC we would like to that those in attendance who expressed their concern re this incident and the behaviour that was demonstrated as well as thank those that reached out personally or via messages of support.

It should be noted that members of MNCC will not tolerate any kind of unacceptable behaviour towards its committee members or those in attendance.
